STAMPEDE REPORT

Weld County Volunteers, Reserves, Mounted Posse and Explorers did it again. Stampede 2004 was a success due in large part to all of the participation of you the members of this organization.

The sheriff's office along with the Stampede Committee thanks you for your help . 1,695 hours were donated during the event. The stampede committee contributed \$5,300 which equals to \$3.12 an hour.

The posse put in 866 hours or 51% of the total hours with 80% participation of their members to have \$2,703 deposited.

Volunteers and Reserves put in 749 hours or 44% of the total hours with 54% of the reserve members involved and the volunteers had 38% of their members participate.

Explorers put in 80 hours for 5%

participation.

Meals were prepared by volunteers Andy and Nancy Sigg with food purchased for a total of \$559.24, Thank you for your help and the great meals. Guest meals provided by Judi & Rod McKenzie and Pat Jones.

A few minor fights, 1 detox hold, 1 DUI arrest, several escorts out of the arena & park areas. No summonses were issued. Mounted Posse members Schwartz & J Herbert apprehended 2 felony suspects in a 4 week old Greeley PD drive by shooting off of horse back before they were able to escape. Old Business: Rich Day to make angle iron bar for new shed.

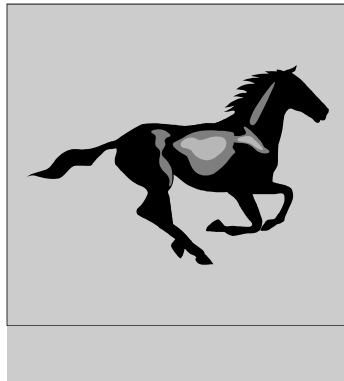
