STAMPEDE A SUCCESS

Weld County Sheriff's Office volunteers, reserves, explorers and posse members donated 1,604 hours during the 2005 event. Stampede Committee has committed to paying \$5,300 equal to \$3.30 an hour. Several escorts out of the park by the mounted units almost on a nightly basis with what appeared to be younger juveniles than in the past. A fire was put out by Bike Patrol at the Social Services building when someone had pushed the wood chips over the top of the ground lighting. Horses were used the first night to clear the arena standing room area at the request of the Wranglers which was effective with the exception that the turn styles were still in place a the exit allowing only two people to exit at a time. That situa-



tion was corrected the following concert nights. Two supervisor inquiries were initiated on two different incidents. Both were cleared. Both GPD and the sheriff's office were on separate radio channels using the new 800 mghz radios until after the concert was done and then the two were patched together by dispatch which made response time much quicker. Nineteen members of the posse participated in the parade along with the honor guard. Posse worked 794 hrs, 50% with 72% member participation, Vol/Resv 628 hrs 39% with 41% of member participation for reserves and Volunteers had 31% member participation, Explorers 175 hr, 11%, initial food cost of \$588.38.

Training: Yearly training is completed, inspite of the weather and

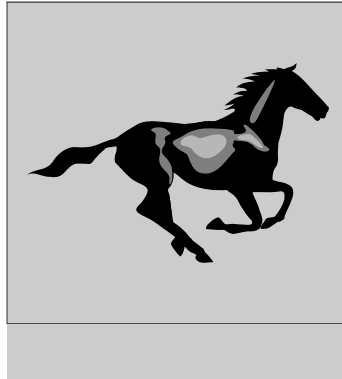
complications, Instructors will evaluate ea member and horse for participation in parades and events.
