The farm show consists of multiple vendors from Colorado and adjacent states geared towards the agricultural community. Participants number in the 1000's who attend this 3 day event. The event is held primarily in the new events center at Island Grove Park. Undersheriff Martinez will supervise this event as approximately 168 hours are needed to be volunteered. The first night on January 24th is a 12 hour fire watch, then 3 people are

needed during the next 3 days as well as two people cover the 6p-6a shift overnight. We provide security for the event as well as assist the farm show staff with parking issues should they arise. This is one of the largest paid events for the volunteer/reserve, posse program. Early in the year is the time to make up some of the credits. The Posse has covered 67% of the hours therefore earning 67% of the \$4,000 to their budget 33% to vol/reserves.

ACADEMY 2005

The P.O.S.T academy is gearing up to being in April, 2005. There have been 28 applications thus far submitted and the mandatory fingerprinting for P.O.S.T. will take place the weekend of Jan 29th & 30th. The results must be returned from both CBI and FBI before the applicant can begin classes. The cost of the fingerprinting is \$39.00 payable to the Sheriff' Office Auxiliary. This amount will be deducted from your total class cost of \$1.700. Those of you who have 200 or more hours

donated to functions will be able to attend the training for a reduced cost of \$1200.00. The class again will produce many new street officers for both this agency and those who are hosted by other agencies. You must have been affiliated with the agency for a length of time prior to attending this training, as this training is provided to those who are interested in assisting the citizens of Weld County. This academy is not intended to be in competition with the other community college training institutes.

POSSE MEETING MINUTES

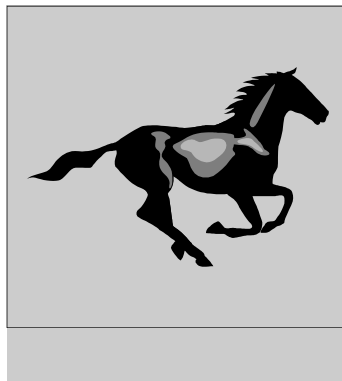
Nov meeting called to order by Pat Foelske at 7:45p, **Treasurer's report:** Balance is \$13,174.17 no transactions during this time.

STATE QUARTERLY POSSE MEETING

16 Weld Posse Members attending the meeting on Jan 23, 2005 hosted by Adams County at Adams County Jail. State Posse has \$3,914.90 in the bank. Proposal was made that jackets be given instead of buckles, considered by Rules Committee, declined. Aprils Meeting will held in Mesa County with a trail ride on the 16th and 17th is the meeting. Weld will host the July meeting. And a vote was taken that Weld would host the state posse meet this year. Motion passed unanimously. Rules changes proposal, 1) clarify rules

in team sort arena size, left up to the sponsoring posse 2) proposal for figure 8, 3) proposal for combining spouse and member events, declined, 4) 5 sec penalty for poles and barrels instead of DQ passed. Judges need to be told where to stand, and the breakaway should read 50-59 and 60 & up, error corrected. A copy of the rules book will be available to each posse to make as many copies as needed. We will need to make a note of who is shooting as they are entered in other events. No YR will be engraved on buckles.
