BIKE PATROL

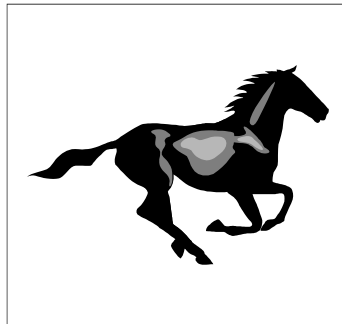
