Road Rage Incident

On October 25, 2017, at approximately 06:11pm, the Weld County Sheriff's Office responded to the area of the 3800 block of Weld County Road 68, in unincorporated Weld County, Colorado, on a report that a male motorist pointed a firearm at another person during a suspected road rage incident. The male motorist was then rear ended by the reporting party. No one was injured during the incident.

When deputies arrived, they learned Justin Russel Erickson and the reporting party, Billy Ray Clymer engaged in an argument on the side of the road over driving actions. Erickson approached Clymer with a gun, got back in his vehicle and drove off.

Clymer followed Erickson, with the attempt to get Erickson license plate number and rear-ending Erikson in the process. The gun was later discovered to be a BB Gun.

Justin Russel Erickson DOB 11-27-1994 was arrested and charged with;
Felony Menacing with a Weapon (Class 5 Felony)
Reckless Driving (Class 2 Misdemeanor Traffic)

Billy Ray Clymer DOB 09-09-1946 was arrested and charged with;
Reckless Driving (Class 2 Misdemeanor Traffic)
