What is Explorers?

Law Enforcement Exploring, also known as Police Explorers, is a career-oriented program that gives young adults the opportunity to explore a career in law enforcement by working with local law enforcement agencies..

Local Explorer programs are chartered by a local law enforcement agency. At least one officer from that agency serves as the post "Advisor". This advisor is responsible for department-level administration of the program and ensuring that the program meets the department's objectives.

Competitions

The Law Enforcement Explorer Post Advisors Association of Colorado (LE.E.P.A.A.C.) sponsors a training conference each year. Over the week explorers compete in teams and as individuals in simulated police actions with awards given for the top teams or individuals in each event. Through LEEPAAC Explorers have other opportunities for training and competitions between Posts.


Awards & Recognition

Public services are a chance for the Explorers to get out in public and interact with the community. Events range from crowd control at parades, to providing security and uniformed presence at events like fairs and sporting events, and directing traffic during mass traffic floods; such as those following sporting and other civic events.

Employment

Many former Explorers have gone on to become Police Officers, Deputies, Community Service Officers, K9 Handlers, Victim's Advocates, Dispatchers, Records Supervisors, and other Administrative Support Personnel.

- ☐ Males and Females accepted
- ☐ Must complete application packet
- ☐ Must attend 100% of the meetings and 90% of the activities during the 3-month probationary period
- ☐ Must be currently enrolled in school and maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher.
- ☐ Must pass a background investigation

Applicants with criminal record, questionable loyalties, moral, or unstable personalities may be denied membership if the investigation establishes facts which warrant such action. The findings will be made to the applicant in written form. A copy will be placed in an inactive member file.
